I was born and raised in Berkeley, California. The first two years of college were at Denison University in Ohio. I graduated from UC Berkeley in 1943 and enjoyed several years' membership in AAUW's Recent Graduate Group in Berkeley. At one point I was president of that group.

I worked in San Francisco for five years, met my future husband "Andy" and we were married in 1946. Employment took us to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in 1949 and our two girls were born there. Connie lives in Benicia, married with two boys. I have a great-grandson, two-years old. Shelley lives in San Diego and heads her own advertising company. I belonged to AAUW in Baton Rouge, but was not very active.

Our employer, Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Co., transferred us back to California in 1963. That was a great help as my mother, who still lived in the family home in Berkeley, needed assistance. 


